### **CAMBP Stats**

Number of members: 345

Number of BEEs in 2021: 2485 hours serving 27,459 people

Number of BEEs since December 2016: 28,912.5 hours serving 136,969 people

Value of CAMBP volunteer hours to the state (@\$25.43/hr value) \$735,244.88

BEEs: Beneficial Education Experiences in the CAMBP are calculated in hours. Each hour a member spends preparing for or engaging in volunteer service, education or outreach in relation to science-based beekeeping and honey bee health is recorded.

- Mount Diablo Beekeepers Association in 2022 (Capstone project)


#### Target #s for each level


